

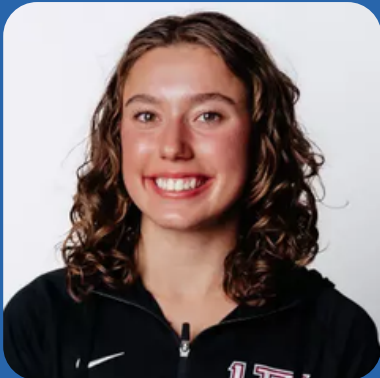


ATHLETE HIGHLIGHTS



Olivia Gibbons- University of Mary Marauders

After winning a conference championship in her debut season Olivia was named NSIC Freshman of the Year. Olivia won the 200 Yard Breaststroke after she recorded a new school record time of 2:20.77. She also earned All-Conference honors in the 100 Yard Breaststroke, recording an NCAA B cut time of 1:03.66. Olivia set school records in the 100 Breast, 200 Breast, 200 FR Relay, 400 FR Relay, 200 Medley Relay, and the 400 Medley Relay. She also helped lead the Marauders to an undefeated dual meet season.



Madeleine McGaughy- Utah Tech University

Madeleine made an immediate impact during her freshman season, emerging as a key sprint freestyle and butterfly contributor for Utah Tech. She played an important role on multiple relay squads that posted top-10 times in program history, while also delivering strong individual performances, including a 23.67 in the 50 freestyle and a 57.60 in the 100 butterfly. Consistently contributing in scoring positions and high-pressure meets, Madeleine established herself as a reliable and versatile swimmer, laying a strong foundation for her collegiate career.



Hanna Vornbrock- Willamette University

Hanna Vornbrock delivered a strong freshman campaign, quickly establishing herself as a leading breaststroker for Willamette. She posted the program's leading time in the 200 breaststroke (2:41.63) and ranked among the top swimmers in the Northwest Conference in the 100 breaststroke, while also contributing in sprint freestyle and relay lineups. Her ability to score in conference competition and step into a leading role as a freshman established her as a key contributor and a strong foundation piece for Willamette's breaststroke group moving forward.

Lincoln Schroeder made a strong impression in his freshman season with Utah Club Swimming, quickly becoming a consistent contributor across practices and competition.
